Branch Overview:

The Pediatric Nursing Branch specializes in the study of subjects related to children's health and their environment, as well as diseases that they may contract and the nursing role in providing health and educational services.

Pediatric nursing and human growth and development are core subjects offered to students in the third stage/undergraduate studies and are taught in a single semester system, in addition to teaching graduate students (master's and doctoral).

The department enables nurses to provide efficient nursing care to children and their families in health institutions and develop their practical skills.

The department assists nurses in preparing and implementing nursing care plans and then evaluating the results based on evidence-based nursing practices.

The department aims to graduate students with knowledge and skills in how to deal with healthy and sick children in various health institutions that care for children through:

Applying self-learning and developing scientific skills, increasing students' knowledge with scientific information specific to children's growth and development through different stages of life. Updating scientific information related to nursing care for children and how to deal with them from physical, psychological, and social aspects. Preparing and publishing scientific research in various fields related to the health care of children and their families. Preparing and presenting workshops and training courses for institutions related to children's health.
